• Spring Clean Drive: From March 20 – May 30, 2025, Montgomery County is collecting essential toiletries and cleaning supplies for low-income families served by the Department of Health and Human Services. Montgomery Township is assisting them by hosting collection boxes in the Township Building and Community & Recreation Center.

- Montgomery Township's Sisterhood Supply Drive is now underway! Donations of hygiene products will be delivered to Mitzvah Circle to support local women in need. Collection boxes will be available at the Township Building and Community & Recreation Center throughout April.
- GLOBO: The Board of Supervisors is pleased to announce the launch of a new language interpretation service through our partnership with Globo. This service allows us to better serve our multilingual community by providing on-demand access to professional interpreters in more than 430 languages. Whether over the phone or through video, Township staff can now quickly connect with a qualified Globo interpreter to assist residents who speak little or no English. If a resident calls or visits the Township building and needs language assistance, our staff will simply use a dedicated phone line to bridge the conversation—ensuring every resident can receive the help and information they need, clearly and confidently. This initiative is part of our ongoing commitment to making Montgomery Township accessible and welcoming to all.
- Red Light Cameras: Cameras have been installed on the Route 202 Parkway (both directions at the intersection with Horsham Road. They have also been installed on Route 309 (both directions) at the intersection with North Wales Road. While there is a 60-day warning period from the date the cameras went live on March 14, 2025, there have been 977 instances of motorists running red lights.
- Bus Patrol Enforcement: Since the start of the school year, Montgomery Township has been participating the North Penn School District's bus patrol initiative to help protect the safety of students and their families at bus stops in the Township. Over 1126 Civil citations have been issued in our Township alone.
- The Wall That Heals: The Township Manager will provide an update on planning for the July event.

MINUTES OF MEETING MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MARCH 24, 2025

1. Call to Order: The March 24, 2025 action meeting of the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors was held at the Montgomery Township Municipal Building, 1001 Stump Road, Montgomeryville, PA. Chairwoman Audrey R. Ware-Jones called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. & 3. Pledge of Allegiance and Announcements: Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Ms. Ware-Jones announced that the Spring Clean Drive will run from March 20 through May 30, 2025. Montgomery County is collecting essential toiletries and cleaning supplies for low-income families served by the Department of Health and Human Services. Montgomery Township is assisting by hosting collection boxes in the Township Building and Community & Recreation Center.

Montgomery Township's Sisterhood Supply Drive begins April 1st. Donations of hygiene products will be delivered to Mitzvah Circle to support local women in need. Collection boxes are available at the Township Building and Community & Recreation Center.

Township Manager Carolyn McCreary updated the Board on the preparations for hosting The Wall That Heals, which will be held in Montgomery Township from July 10th through the 13th. Public Information Coordinator Derek Muller presented the Township's The Wall That Heals Website which features information on volunteering, sponsoring, donations in kind, The In Memory Program, etc.

- 4. Public Comment: Ms. Ware-Jones called for public comment and there was none.
- **5. Announcement of Executive Session:** Township Solicitor John Walko, Esquire, announced that the Board of Supervisors met in Executive Session earlier this evening at 6:15 p.m. in the Township building to discuss a personnel matter and a litigation matter. Mr. Walko stated that the topic discussed is a legitimate subject of an Executive Session under the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Sunshine Law.



6. Consent Agenda:

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Chimera, and unanimously carried (5-0), the minutes of the March 10, 2025 Board meeting and the Payment of Bills for March 24, 2025, in the amount of \$310,724.83 were approved as submitted.

Recognition:

7. American Red Cross Lifesaving Award: Chief Wiegman reported that Justin Tohanczyn, a member of the Fire Department of Montgomery Township, received an American Red Cross Lifesaving Certificate of Extraordinary Personal Action for helping save a man's life in December 2023 on a Royal Caribbean Cruise Ship. Mr. Tohanczyn heard the medical call and immediately went to the aid of a 58-year-old man who was in cardiac arrest. Justin helped with CPR, cleared the man's airway, gathered medical history, applied and delivered the shock with the AED. The man's vitals improved and he was transported to the ship's medical center.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Long, and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board recognized Justin Tohanczyn for his life-saving actions on December 12, 2023.

8. National Library Week Proclamation: Ms. McCreary reported that the North Wales Area Library is a vital resource for Montgomery Township residents, providing lifelong learning and literacy, community connection, technology and job support as well as essential services. It is the Board of Supervisors' honor to proclaim April 6 to 12 as National Library Week.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Ware-Jones, and unanimously carried the Board proclaimed April 6-12, 2025 as National Library Week in Montgomery Township.

Introduction:

9. Appointment of Environmental Advisory Committee Applicant:

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Staab, and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board appointed Andy Mehrotra to the Environmental Advisory Committee to serve an existing three-year term to expire on January 1, 1018.

Presentation:

10. Environmental Advisory Committee Proposal for Native Meadow Garden: Committee members Jonathan Katz and Scott Hemmons presented their ideas for implementing a Native Garden/Meadow in one of the Township Parks. Their goal is to gauge the Board's interest and how to best proceed. The next steps would include a site evaluation, funding sources, etc. The



Board recommended that the EAC make this presentation to the Park Board, so that they can provide input and recommendations.

Public Hearing:

11. Proposed Amendments to Zoning Ordinance #25-347: Ms. Ware-Jones opened the public hearing at 7:38 p.m. by motion, seconded by Ms. Staab. Notes of testimony were taken by Court Reporter Paula Meszaro. Ms. McConnell reported that staff is requesting the adoption of the proposed amendments to the Montgomery Township Zoning Code, Chapter 230, Article XXX, Wireless Telecommunications Facilities to update the current regulations to remain consistent with current technologies, policies, state and federal regulations, and laws associated with wireless communications. In addition, the ordinance will provide Tower-based Wireless Telecommunications Facilities by right within Municipal or Municipal Authority owned properties meeting specific criteria set forth in the regulations. The proposed ordinance was submitted and reviewed by the Montgomery County Planning Commission, Montgomery Township Planning Commission, Township Staff and consultants. Mr. Walko introduced the exhibits into the record. The hearing was closed at 7:41 p.m.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Chimera and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board adopted Ordinance No. 25-347 to amend Chapter 230, Article XXX of the Code of Montgomery Township as presented.

Planning and Zoning:

12. Tress Settlement Stipulation – 108 Cathedral Drive: Ms. McConnell reported that in September 2024, the Township filed a land use appeal in the Montgomery County Court of Appeals, docket #2024-22216, of the Zoning Hearing Board decision for a proposed relative quarters at 108 Cathedral Drive. The issue was the size of the addition. The applicant did shrink down the size as it relates to appearance and moved the addition towards the front of the property rather than the back. The proposed change has less impact on the neighbors at the rear of the home. To resolve the appeal, a stipulated agreement has been prepared for the Board's consideration. Exhibit A depicted the modifications to the 1st and 2nd floors of the proposed relative quarters addition. If the Board approves the settlement agreement, the Township shall withdraw its land use appeal upon court approval.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Long and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board authorized the Settlement Stipulation, Docket No. 2024-22216, and facilitate court approval.

13. Deeds of Dedication – Right-of-Way along Horsham Road & Bethlehem Pike: Ms. McConnell reported that Deeds of Dedication have been created for the ultimate right-of-way along Horsham Road and Bethlehem Pike in accordance with the approved Preliminary/Final Land Development plans dated February 2, 2024 last revised January 25, 2025 for the Quick Lube of Carolina Montgomeryville land development project.



MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Staab, and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board adopted Resolution 2025-06, authorizing the acceptance of the deeds of dedication of the ultimate right-of-way along Horsham Road and Bethlehem Pike.

14. Village Shopping Center – Sewage Treatment Facility Oversight Agreement: Ms. McCreary reported that as part of the proposed redevelopment of the Village Shopping Center, and a condition of the preliminary/final land development approval granted by the Board of Supervisors, the applicant has agreed to enter into an oversight agreement for the private wastewater treatment facility that services the shopping center and the adjacent residential development (The Orchards). The agreement has been reviewed by the applicant's attorney, the Township Solicitor, and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP). Discussion followed and it was noted that the DEP wants clarity for the Township to inspect and oversee, but it is not the Township's responsibility to run the facility. Ms. Bamford inquired about listing the Montgomery Township Municipal Sewer Authority as the inspector, but it was noted that the agreement states that the Township can use its agents and professionals, which covers the Sewer Authority if the Township wants it to do the inspection.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones, seconded by Ms. Bamford, and unanimously carried (5-0), the Board approved the oversight agreement between Montgomery Township and Montgomery Sewer Company, Inc.

New Business:

- 15. Department Reports: Monthly reports were submitted by each department for activity in the month of February. Ms. Staab inquired about the Bark Park and the plan for the rotational area. Mr. Reiff informed the Board that the Township will most likely have to temporarily close the Bark Park to reseed and rest the grass as last year's drought did not help the area maintain healthy grass. Jen Ames, GIS Analyst, provided an update on the current GIS applications available for public and staff use and the applications planned for the future.
- 16. Committee Board Liaison Reports: Ms. Long reported that the gym floor replacement at the Community and Recreation Center is moving along. The Public Safety Committee met and welcomed their newest member Chris Leonardo. Public Works responded to many wind and power outages and traffic signals. The Police are in the midst of the hiring process and the red light cameras were discussed. Ms. Chimera reported that the Shade Tree Commission celebrated the birthday of one of its longest-serving members, Jay Glickman, and discussed the final details for the upcoming Arbor Day Tree Giveaway. There was no Planning Commission meeting. Ms. Bamford reported that the Park Board discussed a potential Blue Bird Box project and the Windlestrae House project fundraising and grant applications. The dog park grass is not in good shape and it has been recommended that the Township close the park for rehabilitation and direct residents to the old park. The Sewer Authority discussed the Rose Twig Park bathroom project which might be completed by mid-April. The Sewer Authority also discussed the





possibility of raising the rates for uses and how to go about it in a reasonable way. Ms. Staab reported that the EAC discussed the Native Plant Garden project. The Business Development Partnership worked on Welcome Packets for new businesses and will be hosting a Networking event in September at Marks Jewelers. Ms. Ware-Jones reported that the Senior Committee discussed their seminars for 2025, hosting an average of 2 a month. The Montgomery County Senior Games will be held the week of May 5th this year and the Community and Recreation Center will host the corn hole tournament again.

17. Adjournment: Upon motion by Ms. Ware-Jones and seconded by Ms. Bamford, the meeting was adjourned at 8:23 p.m.

BACKGROUND:

Montgomery Township Department of Fire Services and Montgomery Township Codes Department have been working together over the last several months to create an Ordinance to regulate EV charging stations, energy storage systems, and the storage of electrical vehicle batteries. The Fire Department of New York City reports a 53% spike in fires caused by lithiumion batteries in 2024, fighting 40 building fires across the city, of which e-bike batteries have been the cause. These fires may result in explosions that create rapid fire spread and extension, trapping occupants due to the storage of e-bikes in areas of ingress/egress. Montgomery Township Staff consulted with third-party contractors to create an ordinance that regulates EV charging and enacts setback requirements to protect lives and property in the event of a battery failure. This ordinance should help ensure the safety of homeowners, business owners, and visitors to Montgomery Township.

The proposed ordinance will amend Chapter 230, ARTICLE XXI, Miscellaneous Provisions, to provide a new section establishing regulations on the placement of and requirements for electrical vehicle charging stations.

Following the authorization to advertise, the amendment will be forwarded to the Montgomery County Planning Commission for review, the Township Planning Commission, and then a public hearing before the Board of Supervisors for consideration and adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-348 MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, 230 ZONING ORDINANCE WORD USAGE, DEFINITIONS, TO ADD DEFINITIONS RELATED TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES AND ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 230, ARTICLE XXI, MISCELLANEOUS, TO PROVIDE A NEW SECTION ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS ON THE PLACEMENT OF AND REQUIREMENTS FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code and the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, 53 P.S. § 10101, et seq., authorizes the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township ("Board") to make, amend, and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the constitution and laws of the Commonwealth when necessary for the proper management, care and control of Montgomery Township ("Township") and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Township and its citizens;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to advance, foster, and promote national, commonwealth and/or Township goals and policies that transition the use of fossil fuels to 100% renewable energy sources and encourage net-zero greenhouse gas emissions;

WHEREAS, to further such goals, the Township desires to implement policies that encourage the use of electric vehicles instead of gasoline-powered vehicles within the Township;

WHEREAS, the use of electric vehicles is becoming more prevalent in and around the Township, and the Township desires to plan for the parking and charging of electric vehicles;

WHEREAS, electric vehicles are commonly powered by an electric motor that uses energy stored in batteries that are charged by plugging the vehicle into an electric power source;

WHEREAS, there has been documented instances of electric vehicle batteries, including lithium-ion batteries, overheating and causing thermal runaway, combustion, fires, and explosions;

WHEREAS, in many instances, thermal runaway, and the resulting electric vehicle fire, occurs while the vehicle is parked and the electric vehicle's battery is charging;

- WHEREAS, when thermal runaway occurs, the fire is driven by a sustained chemical reaction that does not respond to regular firefighting efforts. For example, a battery fire in an electric vehicle could take up to twenty-four (24) hours and require at least 2,600+ gallons of water to extinguish. Further, there is an increased risk of the fire reigniting due to the battery's stored energy;
- WHEREAS, in addition to the length of the fire, the fire tends to burn at a significantly higher temperature. Namely, electric vehicles typically burn at approximately 5,000 degrees Fahrenheit, whereas gasoline-powered vehicles typically burn at approximately 1,500 degrees Fahrenheit;
- WHEREAS, due to the difficulties in extinguishing an electric vehicle fire and the resulting heat, surrounding structures and combustible materials are at an increased risk of ignition from the fire, which may cause structural instability and a faster spread of the fire. In addition, electric vehicle fires occurring inside of structures may not be sufficiently accessible by fire personnel to the extent required to readily extinguish such an enduring and intense fire;
- WHEREAS, current fire sprinkler protection is not designed to meet the hazards caused by electric vehicle fires and may provide a false sense of security;
- **WHEREAS**, the Board is committed to adapting Electric Vehicle Charging Station zoning code requirements as fire suppression technology improves;
- WHEREAS, for the above reasons, the Board desires to regulate the placement and requirements of Electric Vehicle Charging Stations to minimize the increased risks and damage that comes from an electric vehicle fire, and to better maintain the peace, good government, health, safety and welfare of the Township and its citizens;
- WHEREAS, the Board has met the procedural requirements of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, for the adoption of the proposed ordinance, including advertising, submission to the planning commissions, and holding a public hearing; and
- WHEREAS, the Board, after due consideration of the proposed ordinance at a duly advertised public hearing, has determined that the health, safety and general welfare of the residents and guests of the Township will be served by this amendment of the Montgomery Township Zoning Code as set forth below:
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I: CODE AMENDMENTS. Montgomery Township Code is hereby amended as follows:

A. Chapter 230, Section 230-5, Word usage; Definitions, shall be amended to add the following definitions:

ELECTRIC VEHICLE (EV)

An automotive-type vehicle for on-road use, such as passenger automobiles, buses, trucks, vans, neighborhood electric vehicles, electric motorcycles, and the like, primarily powered by an electric motor that draws current from a rechargeable storage battery, fuel cell, photovoltaic array, or other source of electric current. Plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEV) are electric vehicles that have a second source of motive power. Off-road, self-propelled electric mobile equipment, such as industrial trucks, hoists, lifts, transports, golf carts, airline ground support equipment, tractors, boats, and the like, are not considered electric vehicles.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION (EVCS)

A public or private parking space that is served by battery charging station equipment, including any electrical component, assembly, or cluster of component assemblies, that is designed to, or has a primary purpose of, the transfer of electric energy (by conductive or inductive means) to a battery or other energy storage device in an EV.

ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM (ESS)

One or more devices installed as a system capable of storing energy and providing electrical energy into the premises wiring system or an electric power production and distribution network

LEVEL 1 ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION

An electric vehicle charging station that operates on a 15 to 20 amp overcurrent protective device (fuse or circuit breaker) on a 120 volt AC circuit

LEVEL 2 ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION

An electric vehicle charging station that operates on a 40 to 100 amp overcurrent protective device (fuse or circuit breaker) on a 220 or 240 volt AC circuit

LEVEL 3 ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION

An electric vehicle charging station that typically operates on a 480 volt or higher three phase circuit with special grounding equipment. Level 3 stations can also be referred to as rapid charging or fast charging stations that are typically characterized by electrical 400 to 800 volt direct current outputs to the EV that allow for faster recharging of electric vehicles.

LEVEL 4 ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION

Uses a charge of over 1 megawatt (MW) and is used for large commercial vehicles including but not limited to school buses, buses, and large commercial vehicles

SURFACE PARKING LOT

Parking which is not enclosed or created by a structure and is an area 'at grade,' or on ground level.

B. Chapter 230, Section 230-5, Word usage; Definitions, shall be amended to amend the following definition:

PARKING STRUCTURES

Parking in an above-grade, ramp-access, open-air structure specifically designed to accommodate vehicle parking, a below-grade structure specifically designed to accommodate vehicle parking, or on-grade parking sheltered under a building elevated on piers. "Parking structure" shall include the term "parking garage."

C. Chapter 230, Article XXI, Miscellaneous Provisions, shall be amended to provide for a new Section 230-156.7, to provide as follows:

§230-156.7. Electric Vehicle Charging Stations.

A. Applicability

- 1) These requirements under this section for Electric Vehicle Charging Stations shall apply to all buildings regulated under the IBC except for residential buildings having only one or two dwelling units.
- 2) The Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) in Montgomery Township regarding this Ordinance will be the Montgomery Township Fire Chief or designee and the Montgomery Township Director of Planning and Zoning or designee.

B. Placement Requirements for Electric Vehicle Charging Stations.

- 1) An EVCS providing a Level 3 or Level 4 charge or a 480+ volt charging outlet shall not be installed inside or under any structures or buildings or inside, under, or on top of any parking garage or parking structure with a combustible canopy.
- 2) In a surface parking lot, the entirety of an EVCS providing a Level 2, Level 3, or Level 4 charge, including the vehicle parking space area, shall be separate from the following materials and structures by the defined distance:

Item	Distance (ft)
Point of Ingress/Egress to/from parking lot or Emergency Exit Pathway	50
Buildings/Structures	25
Utility Poles	25
Utility Distribution Infrastructure deemed to Pose a Potential Public Safety Hazard by the AHJ	25
Fuel Tank or Gas Pump	25
Electrical Meters, Gas Meters, or Gas Pipes	25

3) In a Parking Structure, the entirety of an EVCS providing a Level 2, Level 3, or Level 4 charge, including the vehicle parking space area, shall be separate from the following materials and structures by the defined distance:

Item	Distance (ft)
Point of Ingress/Egress to/from the structure or Emergency Exit Pathway	50
Utility Distribution Infrastructure deemed to Pose a Potential Public Safety Hazard	25
Electrical Meters, Gas Meters, or Gas Pipes	25

- 4) All Level 2, Level 3, and Level 4 EVCS shall be installed at parking spaces with at least a 10' x 20' parking stall.
- 5) All Level 2, Level 3, and Level 4 EVCS shall not be installed under a combustible canopy.
- 6) All Level 2, Level 3, and Level 4 EVCS shall include all appropriate safety and contact information for reporting issues or problems.
- 7) To protect the EVCS, all Level 2, Level 3, and Level 4 EVCS equipment shall be separated from associated parking spaces by curb stops, curbing, or bollards.

8) An emergency disconnect approved by the Township's Fire Code Official shall be readily accessible, within sight, and installed a minimum of 25 feet and a maximum of 50 feet from all Level 3 and Level 4 EVCS that shall shut off all electrical power to the associated EVCS(s). The emergency disconnect switch shall contain a readily legible sign that says, "Fire Department Use Only - Electric Vehicle Charger Shutoff." The label shall not be handwritten and shall be suitable for the environment in which it is installed.

The disconnects need to be labeled and secured in an approved manner by the AHJ. The emergency disconnect is permitted to be a shunt trip device that opens a remote circuit breaker. The AHJ shall witness the operation of the emergency disconnect.

9) Communal (bank) EV and Lithium-Ion battery charging stations for personal transport, such as bikes, hoverboards, and scooters, shall not be located within 50 feet of the point of ingress/egress of a garage or lot. The Authority Having Jurisdiction will approve the location.

C. Permitting Process of Electric Vehicle Charging Stations.

- 1) All EVCS shall obtain approved Permits from the Township before installation or voltage upgrade. The electrical installation/upgrade shall be approved and accepted by the Montgomery Township Department of Planning and Zoning and a Township-approved Third-Party Electrical Inspection.
- 2) All Permits shall include plan drawings for review.

D. Energy Storage Systems

- 1) All energy storage systems shall obtain a Permit from the Township before installation or upgrade. The installation/upgrade shall be approved by the Montgomery Township Department of Planning and Zoning and a Township-approved Third-Party Electrical Inspection.
- 2) All Permits shall include a drawing of plans for review.
- 3) An ESS shall not be installed below grade without the approval of the AHJ.

E. Storage of Electrical Vehicle Batteries

1) All electric vehicle batteries, when separate from a vehicle, including new, used, repurposed, and damaged batteries, shall be stored in an appropriate container/enclosure and location. The type, size, and location of the batter container/enclosures shall be approved by the AHJ.

2) All electric vehicle-damaged lithium-ion battery storage areas will not be located within 50 feet of the buildings. The AHJ will approve all areas used to store damaged lithium-ion batteries. This will comply with building setbacks as established per the zoning district.

SECTION II: REPEALER. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith or in conflict with any of the specific terms enacted hereby, to the extent of said inconsistencies or conflicts, are hereby specifically repealed.

SECTION III: REVISIONS. Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors does hereby reserve the right, from time to time, to adopt modifications of, supplements to, or amendments of its Ordinance, including this provision.

SECTION IV: SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not prevent, preclude or otherwise foreclose enforcement of any of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION V: EFFECTIVE DATE. This amendment shall become effective five (5) days after date of adoption.

SECTION VI: FAILURE TO ENFORCE NOT A WAIVER. The failure of Montgomery Township to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall not constitute a waiver by the Township of its rights of future enforcement hereunder.

Dear Montgomery Township Resident:

Everyone involved in this process is deeply committed to the safety of our residents and motorists who travel through our Township.

Along with the Board of Supervisors, I would like to personally apologize for the project moving forward without communicating the steps being taken along the way. Community input is an important part of evaluating any major project. Although our intentions were good, we failed to communicate all that has been evaluated as a traffic-calming approach along Grays Lane and why chicanes were now being considered.

As many of you know, the speeding concerns along Grays Lane have been an ongoing safety issue for several years. While many options were considered, the decision to move forward with chicanes was based on recommendations from our Police Department in collaboration with our Public Works staff and our Township Traffic engineers. This was then brought before the Public Safety Committee and ultimately the Board of Supervisors for consideration. While the visual impact of the design is different, chicanes are a traffic-calming technique that has been successfully used elsewhere.

Below, please find other measures that were discussed and the reasons why they were **NOT** considered:

- Roundabouts, as this would involve securing additional roadway by taking portions
 of private properties along with the cost for design, engineering, and construction.
- STOP signs, as they are not permitted to be used to calm traffic or reduce speed.
 Although Grays Lane is a Township road, we must follow PennDOT regulations. This ensures consistency in municipalities throughout the Commonwealth.
- Speed tables, as the grade of the road of the road exceeds 5%, and PennDOT would not approve the installation.

- Speed bumps, as they are an impediment to first responders, particularly EMS when they are transporting patients. They also present a hazard to Public Works staff when they are plowing roads. Forgetting to lift the plow because of visibility or heavy snow accumulation could not only damage the truck but injure the driver.
- Directed patrols can be used in areas of the Township where speeding motorists are an issue, but we cannot used radar as only the State Police are permitted to utilize radar in Pennsylvania.

Traffic Enforcement History (2023 - 2024):

- Radar Not permitted for non-PSP Law Enforcement
- Electronic Speed Timing Devices: Speed= Distance/Time
 - This is what the department used for traffic enforcement. This is in conjunction with two large visible white lines that are painted at a recorded distance and input into the Electronic Speed Timing Device. The downside to this method is that the police officer must see the lines to enforce speed violations. This, in turn, allows the driver to see the area of the traffic enforcement area and the police officer, which in turn causes the driver to reduce speed through the marked distance. While this is a good enforcement and education strategy, it is only effective when a police officer dedicates patrol time to the area. Also, by the PA Vehicle Statute, a police officer cannot enforce a speeding violation unless the driver is driving 10 miles per hour over the posted speed limit.

• Smuggler's Notch (Stowe, VT):

Chicanes were installed to prevent commercial trucks from getting stuck on the narrow, winding road.

 Used to prevent large trucks from entering roadway where they commonly became stuck

Kalamazoo (Michigan):

Chicanes were implemented in the Northside neighborhood as a traffic calming measure, as an alternative to speed bumps.

- Reduced speed and crashes by 29%
- Removed despite effectiveness and replaced by speed humps due to resident complains

• Boise (Idaho):

A pilot project used chicanes to reduce speeds and egregious speeding in the 3700, 3900, and 4000 blocks.

Termon Avenue (Pittsburgh, PA):

Chicanes were added to Termon Avenue, from California Ave to Brighton road, to reduce speeds.



Colerain Twp 2021

Conducted a trial and have since installed multiple sets in residential neighborhoods which are used as cut-throughs to Cincinnati. Noted decreased speed and crashes in locations usd


Raleigh NC - Brentwood

- Replaced speed bumps with chicanes
- -After it installs traffic-calming measures, the city returns to again record traffic speed and volume. On Brentwood, the average speed dropped nearly 16%, Shumaker said, from nearly 37 mph to 31 mph

Perhaps more importantly, Shumaker said, the city has logged a 45% reduction in the number of crashes reported on Brentwood since the traffic-calming measures were put in and a 75% reduction in speed-related crashes.

Chicanes: A Creative Approach to Encouraging Safer Driving

Chicanes are a series of gentle curves or alternating lane shifts built into the roadway, compelling drivers to reduce speed as they navigate the altered path. These structures can be created using landscaped islands, planters, or other visual elements to enhance the aesthetic appeal of neighborhoods. Chicanes not only reduce vehicle speeds but also increase driver attentiveness by requiring more careful navigation. This approach fosters a safer environment for all road users while adding a touch of greenery or architectural interest to the streetscape.



Alexandria Drive, Austin-Texas

Based on the collected data, 85th percentile speeds appear to have dropped by roughly 10 MPH and are now in compliance with the posted speed limit.

The average daily traffic shows the actual number of cars traveling along Whitechapel and using the chicanes during the trial. If traffic numbers severely dropped, it would mean that traffic was diverting to other routes and that is not an outcome that we want. This data shows that vehicles are not using a different route to get to where they are going. This is a favorable result.

The average speed is just that, the average of all vehicles using Whitechapel. The average speed dropped 5.7 mph (23%) with the installation of the chicanes. This is a favorable result.

The 85% speed is what engineering studies rely on when doing traffic and speed studies. This is the speed that 85% of the vehicles are traveling at or below on the roadway. This data shows that the 85% speed dropped by 4.4 mph (14%). This is a favorable result.

With these favorable results, the chicanes will be installed when Whitechapel goes to construction in 2024.


